- seems disoriented or cannot stand or walk
- is bleeding profusely or shows evidence of a burn
- or large sting or bite
- is constantly crying, mewling, or purring
- is vomiting or retching continuously
- is listless and has a dry mouth and gums
- shows signs of having ingested a poison
- is straining to urinate
- is vomiting and has diarrhea
- has a squinted eye
- is not using one leg
