

New Abstracts of Research Employing the Leadership Practices Inventory® (LPI)

Academics the world over have studied the principles and practices of The Leadership Challenge. And the research abstracts they have developed offer valuable insight into the results that can be achieved when this powerful model is applied in any number of different settings--from nursing professionals in Turkey to corporate managers in Florida.

At the Leadership Challenge website, 18 new abstracts have been added recently that provide fresh examples of The Leadership Challenge model in action:

- * What happens when a private urban high school principal adopts The Five Practices of Exemplary Leadership®?
- * What are the psychometric properties of the Leadership Practices Inventory® (LPI) for nurses in Turkey?
- * As measured by the Student LPI, what is the effect of gender and nationality on the leadership practices of student athletes in the United States and Japan?
- * Surveying 77 senior managers from over 60 companies in Florida using the LPI, what is the relationship between corporate leadership beliefs and changes in a company's revenue?

Covering a range of topics and providing examples of real-life applications and results, the research section of The Leadership Challenge website features abstracts in seven categories: Business, Secondary Education, Health Care, Higher Education, Government/Public Sector, Not-for-Profit/Community Based, or Religious.
