<b>TITLE</b>	Finance Executive Leadership Competency and Stock Value Trends in the Presence of Increased Regulation

<b>OBJECTIVE</b>	The purpose of this study was to understand the relationship between the leadership competency of public organizational finance leaders and organizational capitalized stock value.
<b>METHODOLOGY</b>	The Leadership Practices Inventory was completed by 106 finance leaders in the same number of public companies listed on the New York Stock Exchange (49% response rate). As the dependent variable, stock trend was traced over 12 months (August 2004-July 2005) to determine increase and decreases in stock value and compared to the Standard & Poor's 500 composite to establish a baseline of sample representation of stock value.
<b>KEY FINDINGS</b>	A statistically significant correlation was not found between the five leadership practices and stock value trends.
